Relating to the Stateline Gage RFP**

Can the consultants visit the gaging sites prior to submittal of the RFP?

Yes, however please make arrangements with Randy Tullis (307-532-2248) of Wyoming to visit the stateline gage and Tom Hayden (308-262-1932) of Nebraska to visit the Tri-State and passing gage locations.

Are rating curves and rating measurements available for the Tri-State flume?

Such as as-built/design plans, gage measurement data, stage-discharge relationships.*

Yes, the states are currently working to develop the available data for the three gaging sites.

Is there any geotechnical data available for use in the analysis? Items of interest would be soil boring logs, depth to bedrock, etc..

Geotechnical data is not available for the State Line gage, Tri-State flume or passing Tri-State gaging locations.

Can more information be provided on the location and history of the Passing Tri-State gage? Such as coordinates of measurement sections, gage location, gage type, etc...

The Passing Tri-State gage is used for surface water administration in Nebraska. The gage has a complete worked-up final record through 1997 with extensive measurement data available subsequent to 1997. The gage is an Isco 4230 bubbler flow meter with a chain base gage. The location of the measurement section is available and can be shown to any interested consultant by contacting Tom Hayden in the Bridgeport office (308-262-1932).

***Will past involvement in the now-settled North Platte litigation between Nebraska and Wyoming be a consideration in evaluating proposals for the State Line Gage project?
Will such past involvement be considered a conflict-of-interest for the present work?***
